

Politics in the Bible

Preachers are warned repeatedly: *Keep politics out of the pulpit!* It's good advice, especially in recent years as the IRS has cracked down on mixing the two for fundraising. I will never tell you whom to vote for; I'll let Jesus help you figure that out, LOL.

This summer, however, our Sunday lessons from the Hebrew Scriptures will be *entirely political!* Politics from about 1,000 BC, that is; and the politician is David, the former shepherd and giant-slayer. We've already heard how he was secretly anointed to be the next king by the prophet Samuel, when David was young. Then how he ran off to join the army and killed Goliath with his slingshot, earning him a place at King Saul's court where he learned the machinations.

King Saul turns out to be emotionally unstable, unfortunately. Our readings skip over the stories of Saul's mood swings, and how David soothes him by playing his harp; and later, how Saul's jealousy grows intense when David's popularity increases. Saul's own son Jonathan becomes David's best friend (see 1 Samuel ch. 18 for just how close) causing further tension in the royal household. Eventually Saul orders the arrest or death of David, who then takes off with his own band of

warriors – this is like something from *Game of Thrones*, folks! We'll only get highlights on Sunday mornings, but it's worth reading the whole thing at one sitting if you can (1 Samuel ch. 8 through 1 Kings ch. 2).

What's amazing is how detailed the accounts of David's actions and decisions are! Some reports, like his "inviting" Bathsheba over to the palace, raping her and arranging for the death of her husband (July 28's reading), are deeply disturbing in their honesty. In seminary, we were told about the "Court History," a document now lost but assumed to have existed; in which an official within the court took notes on what went on. No expletives, sins or reactions were deleted from the record. Fascinating to imagine, isn't it? This secretary would have been scratching away on papyrus, or maybe clay, as David either pleases or disappoints the people, and the Lord.

Your preachers won't always comment on the David epic. But, we hope you'll enjoy this summer's series of *David* readings. Perhaps the Lectionary wants to disabuse us of the idea that politics don't belong in worship. Once upon a time, they were the same story.

Dilemmas and Deeper Faith

Daughter your faith has healed you.

Mark 5:34



During a Saturday morning Bible study, a father was perplexed because his beloved, wayward daughter had returned to the city, but he was uncomfortable with her in his home because of her behavior. Another attendee was not well in her body because the physical effects of long-term disease and aging had taken their toll. Numerous visits to numerous doctors had yielded minimal progress. She was discouraged. By divine design, Mark chapter 5 was the Bible passage they studied that day. And when the study was over, hope and joy were palpable.

In <u>Mark 5:23</u>, Jairus, a father with a sick child, exclaimed, "My little daughter is dying." On His way to visit the girl, Jesus healed an

unnamed woman of her long-term health issue, saying, "Daughter, your faith has healed you" (v. 34). Jairus and the woman, compelled by faith in Jesus, sought Him out and they weren't disappointed. But in both cases, prior to meeting Jesus, things had progressed from "bad to worse" before getting better.

Life's dilemmas don't discriminate. Regardless of gender or age, race or class, we all face situations that perplex us and send us searching for answers. Rather than allowing challenges to keep us from Jesus, let's strive to have them stir us to deeper faith in the One who feels it when we touch Him (v. 30) and who can make us well.


